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New updates:

- The district will host the first of a three part series of community forums on the topic of equity in RJUHSD. The goal is to give voice to three groups; students, staff and parents/community. COVID-19 compliance updates:

- The COVID-19 Prevention Plan (CPP), the COVID-19 Safety Plan (formerly known as Reopening Plan) and the COVID-19 Checklist can all be found through our district website under the COVID Resources and FAQ [link](#).
- The state released it's Safety Review Plan process on February 11, 2021. The district will navigate the process quickly and thoroughly to be well ahead of the February 17 submission deadline.

Zoom vs. in-person learning:

- More students have been Zooming from home despite indicating that they'd attend school in-person, which makes instruction planning more challenging. Unless a student has a health concern, we encourage all students who indicated they'd attend in-person to come to campus.
- We are assessing offering a virtual learning option for interested students in the 2021-22 school year. Stay tuned for more details as more information becomes available.

Testing + vaccine updates:

- Vaccinations are being offered to those 65+, and those in education, childcare emergency services and food + agriculture.
