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Updates:

- RJUHSD's Board of Trustees announced John Becker has been named as the district's next superintendent and will assume duties July 1, 2021 upon the retirement of Interim Superintendent Jess Borjon. Congratulations to both John and Jess!

- The RJUHSD is adapting to ongoing updated California Department of Public Health guidelines related to graduation.
- School staff is working to potentially host traditional events such as Senior Ball.

High school sports + activities:

- Indoor sports athletes must test at least once per week and have a negative result to compete. Water polo players must also test weekly if the case rate is 7 per 100,000 or higher.
- For indoor sports, spectators will be allowed to attend games starting April 15th. Based on the updated guidance from CDPH, RJUHSD gymnasiums will start with 100 attendees for each event. This will require advance purchase of tickets, assigned seating, physical distancing, and wearing a mask.
- Performing Arts has the approval for a complete return to indoor rehearsal and performance with the proper safety mitigation strategies in place. Performances will follow the indoor event and performance guidance recently released by the CDPH.

Wellness updates:

- RJUHSD staff and students concluded Take Down Tobacco (and Vaping) Week today, a campaign geared to engage and educate our youth about the effects of using these products. We were proud to see students having honest conversations with their friends and asking critical questions.

Academic testing:

- The College Board released their [Advanced Placement testing schedule](#) for May/June 2021, which includes three different testing windows. After considering all the options, the district has decided to administer AP exams during the second window, Administration 2. Most exams will be offered online, unless required by the College Board to be paper/pencil exams taken in person on campus. Online exams would be taken at home using the school-provided Chromebooks. Students who do not have reliable internet at home will be provided space at their home campus so that they can access reliable WiFi for AP exams.
