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Updates:

- We concluded our first-ever community forum series this week with a focus on parent voices. The district sees the need to clearly define our next steps to improve equity within the district and to move beyond conversation toward taking action. Thank you to all the parents who participated. High school activities :

- Spectators of indoor sports are now allowed based on the updated guidance from CDPH. RJUHSD gymnasiums will start with 100 attendees for each event. This will require advance purchase of tickets, assigned seating, physical distancing and wearing a mask.
- CDPH has released [graduation guidelines](#) that our school sites are using to develop ceremonies in communication with senior students and families.
- Athletics has modified the return to participation after quarantine using the laboratory path for clearance. You can find this information at the link [here](#).
- Our quarantine procedures have defined “close contact” as being within 6 feet for 15 minutes or longer within a 24 hour time period of a positive COVID case.
